"Shoshana Bein Hachochim" is the long-awaited subject learned in Kitah Gimmel. Through interactive lessons and scrapbooking, each girl gains a new pride in being a Bas Melech.

The Shoshana Music & Dance Performance was a culmination of the learning throughout the year. The students practiced their songs and dances for weeks on end, taking the lessons to heart along the way. The girls wowed the crowd at the performance, clearly displaying the effort they had invested. As a moving conclusion, the girls sang the finale to their mothers, expressing their gratitude for inspiring them to constantly grow.









TUKY

Our third graders culminated a year of practicing strategies for effective reading by reading the chapter book, "Tuky - The Story of a Hidden Child." The girls related to Tuky's fun-loving nature and learned resilience and emunah from her remarkable journey at a very young age. Inspired by Tuky who learned to embroider from her mother, the girls also began working on their own embroidery. First and second graders also used the daily sefirah count to explore the value of digits in their math classes. Our third graders used the 49 days of the Omer to master the 7 times table!

LEARNING BY DESIGN

Design Education is based on the idea of implementing learning experiences into action. In **design challenge competitions**, students organize teams to work collaboratively using a range of concepts from current design philosophy. They also develop and test fabrication skills to make scalable physical objects that model a proposed solution. Once completed, each team interprets findings and communicates results effectively.

Science classes for our eighth graders this year ended with a bang, with a visit to a **planetarium**. There was no need to leave school for this fun activity—it came to us at **470 Lefferts Avenue**! 




SCHOOLWIDE READING INITIATIVE

ACHOS HATMIMIM

Achos Hatmimim is a program that encourages personal growth, using a point system to support students to grow "mechayil el chayil" in their Yiddishkeit. Students participate in farbrengens and are also involved in special projects. At the conclusion of the year, all members of Achos Hatmimim join a retreat, and a few lucky girls win a raffle to Eretz Yisrael. (This year's destination will be in the US.)

KI KAROV CONTEST

While "Diving In" to the possuk of Ki Karov Eilecha, GO introduced a new initiative. Each girl had the opportunity to express a concept in Chassidus that is applicable to her life through any form of art. Their artwork was sent in to a panel of esteemed judges and presented at the grand "Chassidus is Key" contest where winners were chosen to receive prizes including a Rebbe dollar.
