Letter from the Executive Director:

Dear Parents שיחי,

As *Chof Bais Shvat* is almost upon us, we reflect on *Rebbetzin Chaya Mushka's* נ"ע contribution to mold Lubavitch into what it is today. Numerous institutions and projects proudly carry her name. Of them all, our very own school, *Campus Chomesh*, has perhaps the most far-reaching influence.

Every day, close to 1,800 students are nurtured and educated in *Campus Chomesh*. It is in this building where the Rebbe and Rebbetzin's *kinder* grow up to become leaders of *Chabad*, touching the lives of people the world over.

A school that carries the *Rebbetzin's* name, must also model her values. On the walls of our classrooms, hangs a poster with **Four Core Values** which are the foundation of our students' *chinuch*. They are in essence the cornerstones upon which *Rebbetzin Chaya Mushka* built her life:

1. *Derech Eretz* – The *Rebbetzin* gave much respect to others, yet minimized her own position. She embodied dignity and refinement in every aspect of her life.
2. *Hakoras Hatov* – Expressing appreciation was the *Rebbetzin's* signature trait. She even reached out to those who were mindful to thank the *Rebbe* for their good outcomes and developed close friendships with them.



3. *Chesed* - When traveling in a car, the *Rebbetzin* had a keen eye to notice people in need. She sent assistance without them ever knowing that she was the donor. She explained, “My saintly father, the *Rebbe Rayatz* ןבג ן, would say: Whatever a *yid* notices is *hashgacha pratis*, and it is our responsibility to reach out and help.”
4. *Self-Growth* - Special times require special measures. The *Rebbetzin* lived through two World Wars and the antisemitic oppression of the Soviet Regime. At a young age, she learned to be resourceful and adapt to the needs of the everchanging and challenging times.

The word **Chomesh** is translated as the **number five**. There is one overarching **fifth characteristic** of the *Rebbetzin* that encapsulates the other four, and **defines her life** and the lives of all *N’shei Ubnos Chabad* who carry on her legacy.

5. **Hiskashrus** - The *Rebbetzin’s* major contribution

to the *Rebbe’s* נשיאות was her unwavering ***hiskashrus***. She advocated for the *Rebbe’s* goals to those who could bring them to fruition. She did this with total ***bitul***, never being in the limelight.

Most people never saw the *Rebbetzin*. Yet in her private way, she moved mountains. The *Rebbe’s* words to the *chassidim* were not merely instructions, or suggestions; they were her lifeline.

As we approach *Chof Beis Shvat*, at *Campus Chomesh* and the entire *Bais Rivkah*, we must live with this *hiskashrus* and *bitul*.

May the *Rebbe*, דורנו נשיא, and the *Rebbetzin*, lead us towards *Moshiach Tzidkainu* together with their *kinder* in this exemplary *Moisad Chinuch*.

As students arrive in their שבת clothes and the lunch tables are prepared for the occasion, ימי דפגרא take on a special feeling. Each class enjoys a פארברענגען along with hands-on crafts and activities. Our dedicated Morahs use props and costumes to help bring each special day to life in a fun and exciting way.

- On **כי חשון**, the girls were so excited to learn that each of them is a lamplighter. They took turns pretending to light a pretend lamp and each girl received a light-up ring to keep, making the experience meaningful and memorable.
- In honor of **ראש חודש כסלו**, Bais Rivkah Preschool enjoyed a special trip to the רבי's room and house. The girls were thrilled to kiss the רבי's מזוזה and פרוכת, give צדקה, and say some of the 12 פסוקים in the רבי's room.



- On **יום כיפור**, girls dressed in **כלה** outfits, and the day of the **רבי** and **חתונה** was celebrated with joyful song and dance.
- **יום כיפור** was marked with an immersive experience, as the girls journeyed through the story of the day using life-sized props. They made crowns, learned special songs, and actively participated in bringing the story to life.
- On **ה' שבט**, our preschoolers went on a special trip to Hachai Publishing. There, they met author Dina Rosenfeld and explored how books and **ספרים** are printed. The girls learned about the story of the day, enjoyed a lunch **פארברענגען**, and made their very own book reviews.



MUSIC AND MOVEMENT:

Once a week, each class has a scheduled time for music and movement. The girls love participating in the group activities, enjoying rhythm, movement, and games that make learning active and fun.

Language & Communication Development:

OUTDOOR PLAY:

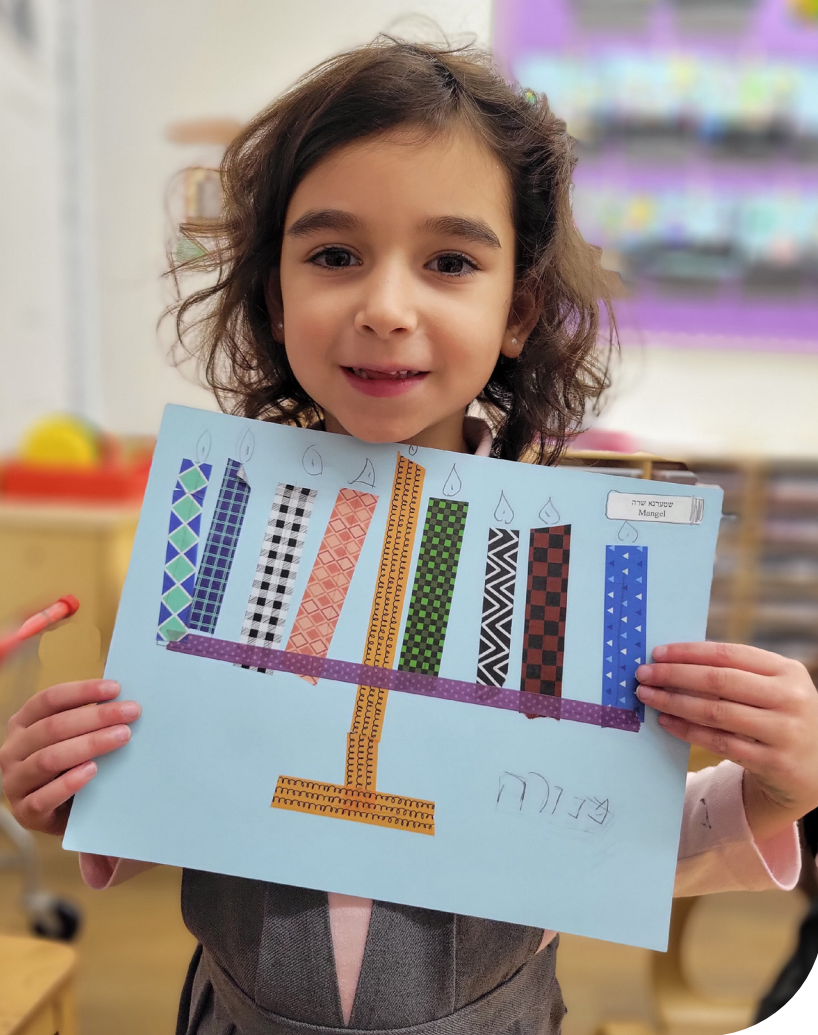
Joyful moments fill our outdoor play as we reach new heights together. Twisting and turning, jumping and looping—and the hula hoops are definitely a favorite!

4TH AND 5TH GRADE:

תבת ה' COMES ALIVE!

On תבת ה', Bais Rivkah Elementary partnered with אור החסידות to make the day inspiring and meaningful for our תלמידות. The ספרים truck was stationed outside Bais Rivkah, and each student was given the opportunity to purchase a ספר.

This exciting store on wheels was in addition to our Bais Rivkah Annual Book Fair.

And that wasn't all! Our 5th grade students went to the Rebbe's Library and were given a very informative tour going through all the exhibits. A questionnaire to fill out as they explored the library ensured that they truly understood each point learned about each Rebbe. At the end of the trip, one winner from each class—the student with the most correctly answered questions—received a ספר as a reward.

6TH, 7TH AND 8TH GRADE HIGHLIGHTS

חנוכה מבצעים:

On חנוכה, Morah Heller's 6th grade went on מבצעים after school, and our entire 7th grade went during school hours. They distributed מנורה after מנורה, brought warmth and light to אידן in a nearby nursing home, and ensured that more אידן would celebrate חנוכה. These moments are the heartbeat of their חסידישקייט in action!

THE חנוכה CHALLENGE:

Over חנוכה vacation, students were encouraged to undertake The חנוכה Challenge—lighting up the nights by learning and being tech-free for half an hour while the candles burned. In the spirit of להלל ולהלל, many girls expressed gratitude to ה' for the blessings in their lives. Some lucky participants won gift certificates to Chocolatee, Sushi, Little Toes, and more!



ה' טבת CELEBRATION:

In honor of ה' טבת, we celebrated the life-force of our school—ספרים and learning. Students earned raffle tickets for engagement and passion in their learning. Four times throughout the day, books were raffled off, and a special ה' טבת scavenger hunt challenged girls to identify different ספרים for another exciting raffle.

SPECIAL GRADE PROGRAMS:

In Bais Rivkah Elementary, our focus is to teach our students to fulfill what the רבי wants from us—to recognize and respond to the opportunities for קדושה that surround us every single day.

We see this developing beautifully in our 6th Grade “Be a Chossid” program and the 8th Grade “Level Up” program, where students actively track their own progress in חסידישקייט, taking ownership of who they are becoming.

We are also so proud of our 8th grade students who joined a הלכה חידון, learning הלכה independently and fostering their יראת שמים in their own time. The Rebbe taught us to increase in light every day—and we are watching our girls do exactly that.



ניגוניםִם: EXPLORING SUNDAY PROGRAM

This year’s Sunday program is devoted to the language of ניגונים. After all, we know that “Music is the pen of the soul.” ניגונים do more than inspire; they awaken something deep within the soul and connect us to the רביים associated with each melody. In the spirit of א, חסידישע חינוך, our goal is not only to teach songs, but to guide students toward internalizing the values and עבודה that each ניגון carries.

From the moment the girls enter the building each Sunday, they are immersed in this experience. They are greeted by our exciting, upbeat school theme song—created especially for our ניגון program and set to the חסידישע tune of ופרצת—followed by the ניגון of the week. This sets the tone for a day where ניגון becomes a vehicle for connection, reflection, and growth.

Each ניגון is taught as a three-week study, allowing students the time and space to truly absorb its message:

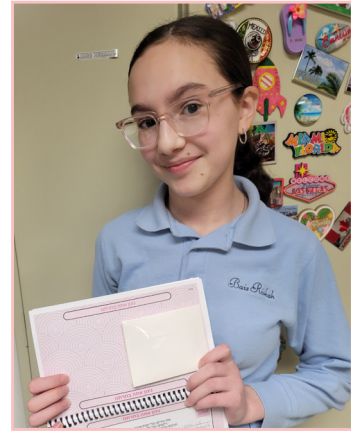
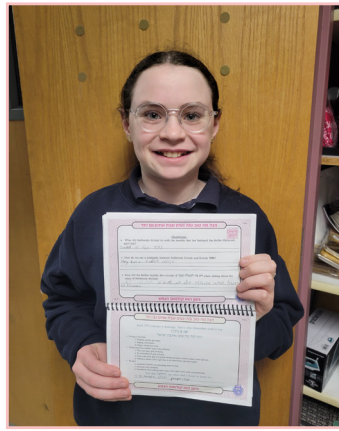
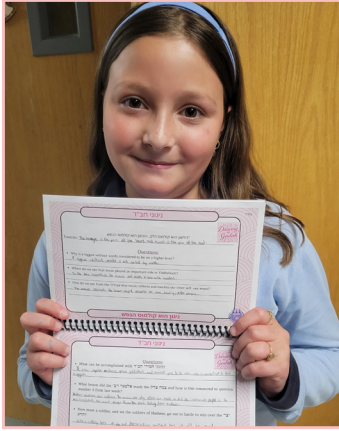
ניגון 1: Introduction to the New

The new ניגון is introduced over the PA system, and every student receives a pre-recorded card—created exclusively for Bais Rivkah—which is glued into their ניגונים workbook.

The teacher presents the background of the ניגון: Who composed it? When? Why? Are there stories connected to its composition? After the lesson, students answer the guided questions in their workbooks, helping them connect knowledge to understanding.

ניגון 2: The Story Behind the Tune—“זאג א ניגון”

The girls hear a meaningful חסידישע story connected to the ניגון, highlighting a מידה and a בפועל— a practical application drawn from the melody. Because ניגונים don’t merely sing a ניגון! They listen to what the ניגון is teaching them, allowing its message to guide their behavior and choices.



Week 3: “המעשה הוא העיקר”

Each class chooses a shared החלטה to focus on over the next three weeks. The החלטה paper is sent home for parents’ signatures, reinforcing the partnership between home and school in a child’s growth. Signed forms earn students the opportunity to have their picture placed inside a tambourine on our ניגון Bulletin Board, along with a scratch-off token. From these finalists, one student is selected to receive a \$20 gift card.

To further reinforce positive behavior and sustained effort, students may earn additional scratch-off cards that reveal tokens. These tokens can be redeemed for snacks and prizes at our very own Bais Rivkah vending machine. In addition, a dedicated recognition bulletin board titled “Dancing To גאולה” celebrates students



who live the lessons of the ניגון beyond the classroom. Music notes bearing students’ names are proudly displayed when they receive positive office referrals from their teachers. These referrals highlight real-life expressions of the values learned—חסד, דרך ארץ, עבודה, הקרת הטוב. Through each of us adding in our עבודה בשמחה, Bais Rivkah is “Dancing To גאולה!”

Through this layered approach—learning, stories, החלטות, encouragement, and recognition—we aim to cultivate students who understand that true growth comes when inspiration leads to action. In this way, the melodies of our Sunday program become lasting tools in shaping hearts, character, and connection to אידישקייט.

ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS

Curriculum Updates:

Here is a glimpse of some of the new curriculums we have introduced in Bais Rivkah High School this year.

- » **Ivrit (9th–11th Grade):** A new לומדים-עברית curriculum—להצליח—has been implemented this year, offering color-coded textbooks and workbooks catering to multiple tracks. The beautifully designed booklets are clear and easy to follow, giving each student the tools to succeed on her level.
- » **Life Skills (10th Grade):** This course equips students with essential tools for life beyond the classroom, blending practical life skills with חסידישע values. Each unit emphasizes self-awareness, personal responsibility, and real-world readiness.
- » **Halacha (11th Grade):** Each student has received her own copy of the sefer *Hakashrut*, an accessible and practical guide to הלכות כשרות. Beyond its use in הלכה classes, this ספר is a useful guide that students can carry with them long after graduation.
- » **Hora'os (12th Grade):** Taught by veteran teacher, Mrs. G. Gansbourg, this curriculum offers an in-depth overview of the הוראות introduced by the Rebbe throughout the years. This course provides students with a clear foundation for living with the Rebbe's guidance.

Technology Awareness and Initiatives:

This year we have hired our first technology coordinator. Our technology coordinator is available as a dedicated resource for parents and students to answer questions and provide support regarding healthy technology use. Mrs. Ashkenazi is working closely with the הנהלה in researching and implementing our updated school technology policy.

Dr. Shalom Augenbaum, clinical director of Tikvah at Ohel, gave a powerful address to our students, encouraging them to better understand technology and build a healthy relationship with it. Dr. Augenbaum also presented an informative virtual workshop to parents on how to support their daughters in making responsible technology choices.

The “Reality Check” Program:

To foster a more vibrant and connected school environment, we have launched the “Reality Check” program. This student-led initiative encourages our girls to be more present in their daily lives, helping them set personal technology goals and build healthy technology habits. The “Reality Check” committee gives a weekly presentation in school, with exciting incentives to keep students motivated to complete the monthly challenges.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR HIGHLIGHTS

PROGRAM: י"ט כסלו

We celebrated ראש השנה לחסידות with a beautiful, full-day י"ט כסלו program. The theme of the program was "איכה" – Where are we holding in our עבודת ה'? What are we doing now, and how can we grow further?

Laura Melincoff, accomplished cellist and performer, shared how the Rebbe's advice has guided her through the pressures of a highly competitive profession, concluding with playing a powerful rendition of 'ד בבות on the cello.

Interactive exhibits displayed life-size models of key moments in the story of י"ט כסלו, while workshops focused on internalizing the themes of איכה and הנשבון חשבון in our daily lives.

The program concluded with a beautiful Kululam of צמאה לך נפשי, with the entire school singing and harmonizing together. All in all, it was a day to remember!



אחות התמימים:

A beautiful upgrade to our אחות התמימים program this year is the added emphasis on attainable personal growth. Every month, students take on one meaningful החלטה, tailored to their individual level. The goal: creating steady, lasting growth, rather than short-term inspiration.

Grade Highlights

9TH GRADE

Every month, the 9th grade focuses on a different theme in various aspects of חסידישקייט and personal growth. Programs and activities throughout the month are centered around that topic. A beautiful bulletin board, decorated and designed by the girls, brings the theme to life. The girls are encouraged to take on monthly החלטות centered on the theme.

The first theme of the year was יגעת'י ומצאתי תאמין. The 9th grade held a meaningful יום עיון focused on this message, featuring a powerful address on resilience by Rabbi Harari, a U.S. Army Chaplain. Students from older grades shared how dedication and hard work paved their paths to success, while fellow 9th graders shared practical advice on staying motivated through challenging times.

In כסלו, the students delved deeper into the meaning of מ'יא פרק, how ה' is always present, and being mindful of that in everything we do. The students learned מ'יא פרק and were encouraged to memorize it.

The theme for טבת is אהבת ישראל, and special programs have been planned to make this message practical in their lives.



10TH GRADE

An exciting addition to the 10th grade this year is the introduction of class מחנכות, fostering stronger and more personal teacher-student connections. The class מחנכות organize class farbrengens, programs, and engaging classroom activities, creating a warm and supportive environment for each student.

10th grade students also have the opportunity to take on the role of Class G.O. of the Month. The G.O. girls assist with monthly programming for their class, alongside the class מחנכת. This initiative ensures that every student has the opportunity to get involved, experience leadership and take responsibility in a structured way.



11TH GRADE

On טבת ה' 5781, our 11th grade students participated in a special learning experience called a "ספרים Search." The girls visited the homes of Mrs. E. Lerman and Mrs. S. Hecht, where they were given a unique opportunity to see a wide range of ספרים, spanning both נגלה and חסידות.

Students explored the ספרים, using prepared guiding questions. In addition, the girls were shown several rare ספרים. The experience was both meaningful and inspiring, allowing the students to connect hands-on with the Rebbe's מבצע בית מלא ספרים.



12TH GRADE

An annual 12th grade highlight is the Seniors Retreat! The girls spent an incredible and uplifting night of unity at the JCM. They heard inspiring words and farbrenge with Mrs. Plotkin, Mrs. Rappaport, and Rabbi Herman. The night continued with dancing led by DJ Struch and a kumzitz led by Mushky Tzfasman.

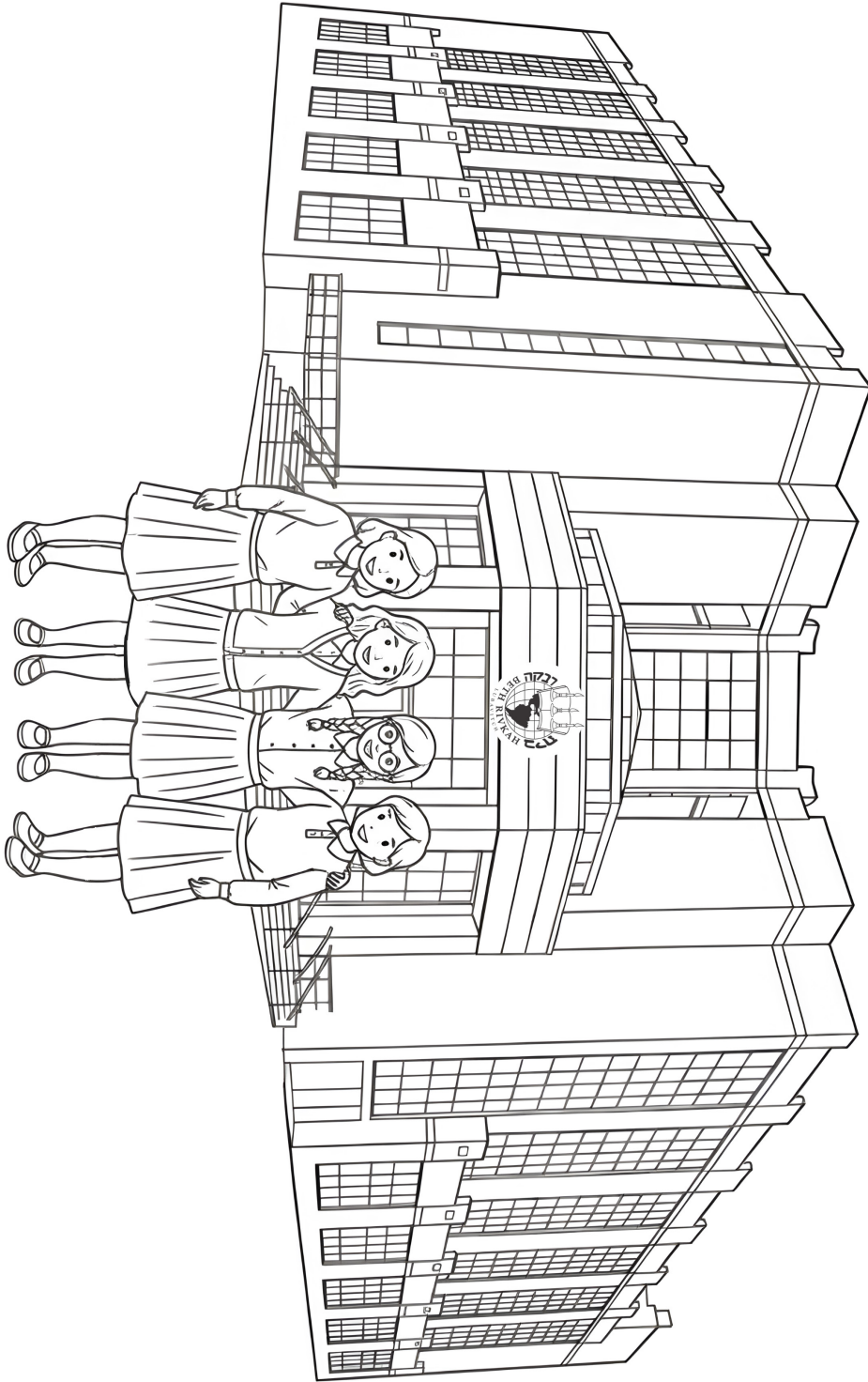
The 12th grade students have spent the recent weeks learning and internalizing Rabbi YY Jacobson's

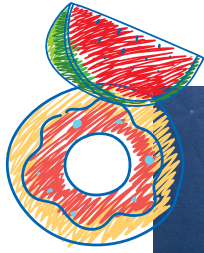

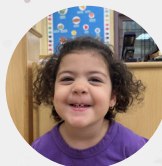
