Letter from the Fxecutive Director

Dear Parents, שיחיו

Bricks. That is the buzz word around Bais Rivkah these days.

As we open a new chapter in the expansion of our school, there is something deeper that is taking center stage.

If you examine the word for brick in Hebrew, "לבנה", you will notice that its root is בן, a child. As we build our building, your child, our child, the Rebbe's child, is being built up simultaneously. Just as bricks are the building blocks of structures, yiddishe kinder are the building blocks of the world.

While building a new building to contain more classrooms, our teachers are building up your children to become resilient Bnos Chabad.

Nearing the Yomtov of Shavuos, it is significant to note that the yidden were zoche to the revelation at Har Sinai of "משפטים: משפטים: There was a **sapphire brick**, nestled under the throne of Hashem. Bnei Yisroel's accomplishments are encapsulated by the Aibershter into the form of a brick, symbolizing their hard toil and labor to reach that milestone.

The brick of the Aibershter, is one of precious stone, whose blue hue reflects the color of Shomayim. Why sapphire? The Alter Rebbe explains that Hakadosh Baruch Hu gives Bnei Yisroel gashmiyus and it is our mission to transform it into ruchniyus. This is the heartbeat of the chassidishe chinuch at Bais Rivkah.

FEEL THE **PULSE:**

נוסים was alive and vibrant in our preschool classrooms! Once פורים concluded, our classrooms swiftly transformed into lively spaces that showcased, וחדש ניסן, חודש ניסן.

All centers in the classrooms took on a חודש ניסן theme:



LIBRARY

Our libraries were filled with NO9 books, including the amazing "Pesach Big Book" by Dassie Pruss, "From Vine to Grape Juice" by Meish Goldish, and "Yael's Pesach Dance" by Malky Weinstock.

BLOCK CENTER

The blocks were transformed into מצוה tanks, and the children recreated the מצוה tank parade with them! We also used the blocks to create א-ב words like מצה and המצה and had fun sorting the different foods into the correct categories.





THE PARTY 9

SENSORY TABLE

Our sensory tables were filled with activity, stocked with spray bottles, sponges, kvorts, and various מכות pieces! We used water to clean our classrooms, experience ורחץ, and mix מצה dough in less than eighteen minutes. We used sand to

form א-ב letters, shape ארב cups, and explore מצה sizes.





ב-CENTER

In each classroom, א-ב was incorporated into multiple centers. We used sand to form א-ב words like the חמץ/מצה or חמץ/מצה. We also matched the letters, sorted them, and the older classes practiced writing the letters.

SKILLS TRAYS

Our morahs were creative in putting together the NO9 skills trays! Some classes focused on counting the מכות, while others had חסס sequencing cards with the steps for making מצה. Many classes worked on patterning, and some focused on fine motor skills, using tweezers to pick up and move NO9themed objects.

DRAMA CENTER

The highlight of each classroom was the transformation of our drama centers into מצה bakeries! We painted the red bricks of the extra hot oven, donned aprons and hats, and covered the מצה poles with foil to take the מצה out of the oven. We used timers to help us keep track of the eighteen minutes, and some classes even had the opportunity to use a wheat grinder to make our own flour!



ו"א ניסן

Leading up to י"א ניסן, we learned about the ten מבצעים, and many classrooms collected מצוה notes based on the מבצעים to wrap up as a birthday gift for the Rebbe. Before the חסס break, we held a י"א ניסן rally. After reciting the twelve מחדלעך and giving אדקה, the עדקה took turns coming up to help complete one of the ten מבצעים posters, such as adding מרצעים poster.

PRACTICE 1TO

To wrap up our entire pre-nog experience, we sat down for a practice אדס. We created our own קערות and walked through each step of the אסר. Some מיידלעך showed great bravery by tasting the כרפס and the אמרות, and the mini Snackers crackers looked so similar to איידלעך? The מיידלעך of Bais Rivkah Preschool were eager to experience everything they had learned during the special יום טוב of nog!

- On פורים morning, Pre-1A and Transition students and morahs came together in school. It was beautiful to see everyone dressed up in their costumes! Morah Zeesy (Zappy by Zeesy) led the girls in davening and the twelve פסוקים, followed by a מגילה reading and מגילה exchange.

In preparation for NO9, every class experienced a model NTO, with each student setting up her own קערה and going through the steps of the NTO. The מיידלעך were so excited to get real grape juice for the four cups, cracker "מצות," and real eggs, onions, and lettuce for their קערות. 
11TH GRADE


