Pre-1A

יומא דפגרא

In Pre1a, יומא דפגרא are a beautiful part of the year!

We started off the day of י"ט כסלו with a beautiful breakfast all together in the lunchroom. The מיידלעך enjoyed delicious danishes and chocolate milk, we sang the פסקים and a ניגון of the אלטער רבי. We had a fancy Fleishig סעודה for lunch in each classroom.

In preparation for י' שבט, the Pre1a classes both memorized the words and learned the meaning of באתי לגני. They learned how we are the 7th generation that will bring משיח! On י' שבט, we had a הקהל gathering with the whole Pre1a. Each class performed a song, including באתי לגני, פרק לב תניא, and songs about מצוות that will bring משיח. We made a החלטה to say the 12 פסוקים every day before bedtime, and the מיידלעך are filling up our bulletin board with the פסוקים badges they bring back to school!

For כ"ב שבט, each class of Pre1a decorated a beautiful צניעות dress and learned from מושקא חי' רביצין how we can be צניעות not only in dress but also the way we speak and behave. On the day of כ"ב שבט we had a הקהל lunch with the whole Pre1a. Mrs. Mushky Feldman, a Shlucha from Iceland, came to speak about her שליחות and how her daughter teaches her friends in Iceland about different מצוות, like Shabbos, and צניעות.



קריאה

B"H the מיידלעך are progressing beautifully in their קריאה skills, well on their way to קריאה mastery! They practice each נקודה through fun activities and games. With daily review at home and in class they are becoming קריאה masters!

דואט ברכות

The Pre1a Classes learned all about where food comes from and which ברכות we make on each food. Each class did various hands-on activities. For המוציא, one class ground wheat for flour. Another class made their own תלה dough from scratch, watching the yeast bubble and kneading in all the flour. For מזונות, they baked yummy chocolate chip

cookies! For האדמה and הנוץ, they made fruit and vegetable salads, and learned about the healthy vitamins they have that help us grow! The מיידלנך also learned the right way to say a ברכה: holding the food in the right hand, nothing else in their mouth, dressed צניעותדיק, and saying the ברכה loud and clear.

GRADES 4-8

BE A חסיד

Be a חסיד program focuses on guiding our 6th graders and helping them maximize their personal development. Students who participate are invited to join special weekly and monthly activities and rewards. Our most recent rewards have included an art project creating personalized נענעל וואסער sets, a trip to the Ice Cream House, a carnival with exciting activities, cotton candy and lemonade and a trip to Seven-Eleven.



CONNECTION POINT

A newly introduced, very successful 7th grade program, Connection Point allows the students to first learn a שיחה and then hear and see it from the רבי in its entirety. Each שיחה has a special message for the students and an opportunity to strengthen their התקשרות and connect with our רבי. At each Connection Point rally the students focus on the words and message of the רבי by filling out the question sheet and then bring that message home to their families by reviewing a summary at their שבת table.

Each week there is a drawing with one winner per class. There is also a global weekly raffle for all students who have read the summary at home.



SKELETON SYSTEM

Mrs. Lefkowitz's 5th grade students learned all about the skeletal system. They gained an understanding of the intricate ways our bones interconnect with each other. In Bais Rivkah, biology is taught through the lens of נפלאות הבורא and learning how we can utilize our bodies to serve ה better. For an exciting activity, they had a "skeletal system" dance party in the gym.



TEACHERS UTILIZE TECH לשם שמים

Our 8th grade חומש classes have been working with לומדי, a new computer based program. לומדי has been designed to improve specific חומש skills and provide more individualized advancement. This learning platform is a simple yet powerful tool that helps students retain knowledge and deepen their תורה text skills.

Our teachers are enthusiastic about the program. It allows them to create dynamic, personalized lessons that are pedagogically sound and fun at the same time!



“IT’S ALL ABOUT THE NUMBERS” MATH FAIR

Numbers are a crucial part of who we are. From childhood we are surrounded by numbers. Numbers have no language or culture of their own. They are a way of life. י' שבט

Each grade participated in activities specifically geared toward them. Programs included a visit to שלוחים, an exciting guest singer, student teaching in a Hebrew Day School and an interactive walk-through where students had the opportunity to learn from every teacher of their grade level. Arts-N-Craft projects were also included in the busy day's schedule.



כ"ב שבט

The culmination of חודש שבט was the full day of special programs arranged for כ"ב שבט, the רביצין חייה מושקא of יארצייט. In the morning, the students' learning included a special custom-created workshop on the כ"ב אותיות, the א-ב, about the holiness they contain and how the letters of the name חייה מושקא can teach them lessons in their own עבודת ה. Each class then created their own א-ב board depicting some of the special things they had learned. The 8th grade enjoyed a concert with Meleha and were inspired by a panel of שלוחות.

Beginning at 1:00 pm, the students participated in a grand banquet. Our dining room was beautifully decorated with elegant tablecloths, paper goods and pretty napkins. The הקהל סעודה was enhanced by dance performances by fifth graders, choreographed and produced by our talented eighth graders. Our fourth graders then participated in an exciting game involving the נידות we learned this year, while the 5th-8th graders enthusiastically participated in a big trivia game that tested their knowledge and kept them engaged until the end. GRADES 9-12

CURRICULUM HIGHLIGHTS

• **WEEKLY הלכה DILEMMA:** A new initiative for this year, the weekly הלכה Dilemma's goal is to bring more emphasis and appreciation of הלכה and how it guides every aspect of our life. Each week the girls receive a Halacha Dilemma to discuss over שבת with family or friends, and to find the correct solution. Answers are sent in by emailing halachadilemmas@gmail.com. On Tuesday morning a raffle is drawn and a prize given to one girl per grade. Look out for this week's הלכה Dilemma!

• **כ"ד טבת WORKSHOP:** In honor of טבת כ"ד, Beis Rivka had a special workshop in their הלכה classes. Split into groups, each group received a scenario where there is a Halachic question. Each scenario was accompanied by Torah sources: the פסוק from which the מצוה is derived, the הלכה discussion in משנה or גמרא, and the application in שולחן ערוך or הרב שולחן ערוך הרב. A question sheet guided them through to use each source to understand how the correct הלכה conclusion is reached.

• **מענה לשון - TRIP TO THE אוהל:** Before going to the אוהל, each class reviewed an abridged version of the מענה לשון to familiarize themselves with what should be said and to understand the content. They took this along to the אוהל for a more meaningful experience.

אמונה PROJECT

One of the special curriculum enhancements in 12th grade is the annual אמונה Project. To launch the project, Rabbi Glick gave a two part workshop on the meaning of אמונה according to חסידות. After, the students each listened to one of Rabbi Y.Y. Jacobson's שיעורים on אמונה and ביטחון, summarized it and presented it to their classmates. Every Wednesday from 7 to 8 pm, students from all grades join to learn in 770. Each student is paired with a girl from


a different grade. It is beautiful to see students engaged in learning well after the dismissal bell.

Behind the Scenes

THE BR UNIFORM SHOP

Join us for a behind-the-scenes look at the hidden heroes who take care of the little details that make for a successful school day.



TODAY, WE TALK WITH:
MARIASHA DEAN DENEBEIM,
BAIS RIVKAH'S PROJECT MANAGER
about the launch of the Bais Rivkah Uniform Shop.

WHAT IS YOUR POSITION IN BAIS RIVKAH?

I work on various development projects that generate funds and improve school experiences.

WHAT MADE YOU START THE UNIFORM SHOP?

Over the years we've received feedback from parents requesting more uniform options that met higher levels of comfort and quality with the most insistent request being affordable pricing! This endeavor was also an opportunity for us to address our students' sensory needs. Curating products with attention to the smallest details of comfort and appearance. We wanted our students to feel good and be proud to wear their Bais Rivkah uniforms!

TELL US ABOUT THE PROCESS OF CREATING A NEW UNIFORM BRAND:

The first thing we did was collect concrete data from the principals, parents and by extension the students. We spoke with principals and got their vision and direction, next we sent

out detailed surveys that covered every aspect of the existing uniforms, from style, quality, and pricing. The feedback was overwhelmingly clear, they wanted cotton polo shirts, warmer sweaters, high school collars, and better prices!

So we got straight to work contacting manufacturers that would be willing to work with us in a shorter than usual timeframe. We were eager to get our products out for the current school year!

Drawings and specs were shared with several manufacturers who produced samples.

We reviewed the samples and selected those with the best materials, colorfast, and workmanship. We were lucky enough to find a manufacturer who not only was able to meet our time constraints and have our products ready for this school year, but one who was able to appreciate the level of detail and customizations we were investing in our products.

Every detail from the dyes used, the type of rib in the collar, and the weave of the fabric were custom-made for our production. Custom molds were made for the buttons and the placement was adjusted to ensure the best coverage for tznius. Even the Bais Rivkah logo was cleaned up and is now proudly embroidered on all the products.


Sizing was the most complex aspect of production. We produced an array of sizes and then went further and created some in-between sizes. We wanted to achieve the perfect fit for each student; accommodating slim and wide fits alike. After months of pre-production, review, edits, tweaks, more review, and then some, our sizes were established and the full production began!

HOW LONG DID THIS WHOLE PROCESS TAKE?

With Hashem's help, we were able to do this at an incredible speed of about eight months from research to delivery. This may seem like a long time but is quite fast considering industry standards. Most manufacturers we spoke with assumed we were producing for the 2023-2024 school year.

AFTER PRODUCTION, WHAT DID IT TAKE TO ACTUALLY SELL THESE ITEMS IN A STORE?





First, we worked on developing the branding to create a consistent look and feel. Then we had to set up a website, a platform for inventory processing and sales and train staff. We set up our first pop up shop at the new BR dorm building. We created clear posters, neat shelving systems, a sample rack and dedicated staff to assist with inventory all to ensure the smoothest shopping experience for our excited customers.

HOW DID YOU STRUCTURE YOUR PRICING?

The feedback we received through the survey made it clear that pricing and affordability were of primary concern. We worked with a higher end manufacturer and sourced quality fabrics which made production and cost prices rather high but we were still able to keep prices low since we did not mark up our prices based on a for a profit business model. Our goal was to delivery a high quality product at the lowest possible prices.

WHAT HURDLES DID YOU FACE ON THE WAY?

Time constraints, shipping and clearing customs were among the most challenging aspects of production, all of which can be improved with the luxury of time and experience that will be afforded to us bez”h in the next season.

We also came to realize that our initial pilot production didn’t range the full gamut of sizes to include extra larger sizes.
