
The HOO program also arranges: rewards, incentives, events, speakers, and training for the volunteers.

They were distributed a second time, when corona hit and we were all home.



- 3. Color and/or decorate.












Each page has it's own board to glue the squares onto.


Instructions:

- 5. Hang it up for all to see!












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






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






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







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

























How to make a PAPER PLATE PICTURE FRAME

Supplies:

- 3 paper plates, each a different size
- Scissors
- · Glue
- Tape
- 2 tongue depressors
- Markers or crayons
- · Photo

Directions:

- Cut out the center circle from each plate.
- Cut the outer rim of the largest plate to look like flower petals.
- Color the three plates.
- 4. Glue one on top of the other, the smallest being on top and the largest on the bottom.
- Tape your photo to the back of the plates so that the center of it is seen through the hole.
- 6. Color the tongue depressors green.
- Tape the depressors together so that it looks like a long stem.
- Tape the top of the tongue depressors to the back of the plates.

Cooked Play Dough

Ingredients:

- 3 cups flour
- 1 cup salt
- 6 teaspoons cream of tartar
- 3 cups water
- 3 tablespoons vegetable oil
- Food coloring

Instructions:

Mix flour, salt and cream of tartar in a large saucepan. Blend water and oil together in a bowl. Add to the saucepan and cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until it thickens. Add several drops of food coloring until you get the right color. Cook for about five minutes. Take the dough out of the saucepan and put it on a cutting board or counter and

knead for a few minutes. Add flour if it's too sticky.

Notes:

The play dough should last around three months if you keep it sealed in an airtight container or plastic ziploc bag. It's so smooth and fun to play with when it's still warm.



No Fuss Play Dough

Ingredients:

- 1 cup cold water
- 1 cup salt
- 2 teaspoons vegetable oil
- 2 cups flour
- 2 tablespoons cornstarch
- Food coloring

Directions:

In a large bowl, mix together water, salt, oil and a few drops of food coloring. Mix flour and cornstarch by adding ½ cup flour at a time, stirring constantly (you may not need the full 2 cups of flour, so make sure to add the flour slowly and to keep stirring until it is the right consistency). With flour on your hand, knead for a few minutes.

Seal in an airtight container or ziploc bag.





How to Make a BOUNCY

Supplies:

- · Rubber bands
- · Piece of tin foil approximately 18-24 inches long
- · Colored rubber bands (optional)

Directions:

- 1. Scrunch the piece of tin foil, creating a tight ball.
- 2. Cover the tin foil with lots and lots of rubber bands. When you begin, you may have to wrap the rubber bands around the tin foil quite a few times to make it stay.

As the ball gets bigger, putting on the rubber bands should get easier and easier.

The more rubber bands you put, the bouncier and larger your ball will become.

 (Optional) When your ball is as big as you would like, cover the outer layer with colored rubber bands. It will make it bright and colorful.





- Any size rubber band will work well. However, the thicker the rubber band, the easier it is to put on.
- 2. Try putting two or three rubber bands on at the same time.

Perch Decerction

Supplies:

- Paper or Styrofoam plates (small or large)
- · Hole Puncher
- · Yarn
- Crayons or markers
- · Art supplies and glue (optional)

Directions:


- Using the markers or crayons, create pictures of your choice on 4-8 plates; depending on how long you want your decoration to be. Pictures can be of mitzvos, designs, words, days of creation, anything.
- 2. Make a hole in the top and the bottom of each plate.
- 3. Connect the plates together by tying yarn through the holes.
- 4. Hang it up and watch it sway as the wind blows. The longer it is, the more fun it will be to watch.

Variation:

- Color both sides of the plates so that when the wind, blows, you see the other side.
- If you have art supplies, i.e. tissue paper, googley eyes, or even tin foil, you can use it on your pictures.

Warning:

Be sure to take down your project before the rain gets it wet!







Welcome Sign

Supplies:

Hard paper Glue Rice or beans Spray paint Pencil



- 1. As neatly as possible, write the words Bruchim Habaim on your piece of paper.
- 2. Carefully, cover the first letter with glue.



- 4. Continue by covering one letter at a time with glue and rice until you've finished both words.
- 5. Let dry.
- 6. Spray paint the entire page the same color.







Pencil Holder

Supplies:

- •Paint
- Popsicle sticks
- Empty frozen juice or bread crumb container
- •Glue
- Newspaper



- 1. For easy clean up, cover your work area with newspaper.
- Paint enough popsicle sticks to fit around your container.
- After the popsicle sticks are dry, glue one by one vertically onto the container so that the entire thing is covered with sticks.
- 4. Store your pens and pencils in your new beautiful pencil holder!







How to make a DREIDEL

Supplies:


Glue or tape

Pencil

Crayons or markers

Scissors

- Carefully cut out the pattern.
- 2. Color.
- 3. Fold the paper on the dotted lines (a total of 16 folds)
- 4. Attach it together with glue or tape.
- 5. Insert a pencil to use as a spinner.





Bencher Holder

Supplies:

- · Empty cereal box
- Scissors
- Paint or construction paper
- Stickers

Directions:

- Cut the cereal box 4-6 inches from the bottom so that you have the bottom section. Feel free to cut it on a slant for a nicer looking bencher holder.
- 2. Paint or cover the entire box with construction paper.
- 3. Decorate with all sorts of stickers.
- 4. Place your benchers inside and use it at your table!


How to make a Large

Pretend Torah


Supplies:

- 4 1 liter seltzer bottles
- · Gold spray paint
- Thick tape
- · Material
- Glue
- · Glitter or sequins

- Holding the bottom of the seltzer bottle, spray paint its top half, turning it as you spray so that the whole top becomes gold.
- 2. Repeat step 1 for the other three bottles and let dry.
- 3. Tape the four bottles together as shown in the picture.
- 4. Cover the bottles with material, leaving the bottom two or three inches of the bottles sticking out as
- 5. Decorate with glitter or sequins.
- Sing and dance around your house, holding your Torah!







Directions:

- 1. Trace the lid six times onto the construction paper, creating six different circles.
- 2. On each circle, draw a picture of your choice.
- 3. Make a hole on the top of each circle.
- 4. Connect the circle to the hanger by tying the yarn through the hole and around the hanger.

If you have art supplies, (pop poms, etc.) use it to create more artistic pictures or designs on your mobile.




How to make PUPPETS

Supplies:

- An empty toilet paper roll
- · Popsicle sticks
- Glue
- Scissors
- Construction paper
- Any craft supplies you may have (felt, googly-eyes, yarn, etc.)

Directions:

- 1. Cover the roll with construction paper.
- 2. Draw, cut and glue any shape, size, face features, clothing or body you would like. Be creative! Have fun! There is no one way to make them!
- Glue a popsicle stick inside the roll, leaving about half of the stick sticking out, so you can hold your puppet.

COTCHERS

Supplies:

- 9 inch paper plate
- 7 inch piece of wax paper
- Crayons and / or tissue paper
- Scissors
- Hole puncher
- Yarn




Directions:

- 1. Cut out the round center of the plate
- 2. Glue the piece of wax paper to the back of the plate so that from the front, you see it only through the circle.
- 3. Decorate the plate with any design you would like using crayons and or tissue paper.
- 4. Punch a hole in the top and tie a piece of yarn through it so that your sun catcher can be hung
- 5. Hang it near a window and when the sun is out, your project will 'catch' it.

Supplies:

- Piece of construction paper
- Colored cellophane
- · Markers or crayons
- Scissors
- Tape



- 1. Color the piece of paper so that it's very colorful.
- 2. Cut out a shape of your choice from the center of the paper.
- 3. Tape the cellophane to the back of the paper so that from the front your cut-out shape is covered with
- 4. Hang up your sun catcher into a window and the cellophane will glow as the sun shines through it.






Supplies:


- Pattern pieces from the next page
- Scissor

- 2. Cut the spout off of your orange juice container, leaving at least one inch around it.
- 3. Color the flowers.
- 4. Tape the spout in middle of the complete flower.
- 5. Glue the second flower (the one with the hole) on top of the first flower so that the orange juice lid is sticking out in middle.

How to make a BALLOON MENCHIE

Supplies:

- Balloon
- Glue stick
- Crayons or markers
- Paper
- Scissors
- · Yarn (optional)

Directions:

- 1. Draw two eyes, two ears, a mouth and a nose.
- 2. Cut-out each of them.
- 3. Blow up the balloon.
- 4. Glue the eyes, nose, mouth and ears onto it.
- Draw and cut out feet.
- 6. Glue the feet to the bottom of the balloon.

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7. Optional: Using the yarn, give your little menchie some hair.



Treasure Box

Supplies:

Newspaper Bottle of glue Popsicle sticks



- 1. Cover your work area with newspaper to protect it from getting sticky.
- 2. Lay 12 popsicle sticks next to each other.
- 3. Put glue on both ends of each stick.
- 4. Put a popsicle stick on top of the glue on both ends.
- 5. On the corner of each stick, put a small dot of glue.
- 6. Take two popsicle sticks. Each should go from one of the corners to another. Place the stick in the direction that only the corners should be touching a stick, the middle of the stick should be parallel to the stick underneath it, but not touching.
- 7. Repeat steps five and six over and over again. Each time the sticks should be going in different directions (one time vertical, one time horizontal, one time vertical, etc.) creating a taller container. Repeat until your container is at your desired height.
- 8. Do not remove from the newspaper, until the glue has completely dried.

Creating a Cover

- Follow steps 1-6 from above.
- 2. To make your lid sturdier, glue two or three layers of sticks.
- 3. Let dry.
- When it's completely dry, turn it over and put a thin strip of glue between the sixth and seventh stick.
- 5. Place a popsicle stick upward so that you can hold onto it, to hold the lid during opening and closing.




















Homemade Streamers

Supplies:

• 9 inch paper plate

Directions:

- Color both sides of the paper plate.
 If you are making it for a party with a color scheme, color it according to the scheme, if you are making just one as a decoration, color your plate very colorful.
- 2. Start about 1/8 of an inch from the end of the plate and start cutting around and around until you reach the center.
 - Pull one end of the plate and you'll be surprised how long it stretches. Hang it from a light fixture so that people can see both sides. Or, make a few and hang them on your wall. You can make each one a different color which would make your wall very bright!

How to make a Paper Wallet

Supplies:

- 1 1/2 pieces of hard paper
- Markers or crayons
- Scissors
- Glue or tape
- Velcro (optional)

Directions:

- 1. Color one side of both papers.
- Fold the bottom of the full -paper upwards so that about two inches of the paper remains sticking out.
- Glue or tape the folded paper so that it's like a pocket.
- Fold down the remaining two inches so that the wallet closes.
- To make your wallet a little bit fancy, cut the top two inches into a design.
- 6. Using the second paper, cut out the shape of a handle.
- Tape or Glue the handle to the wallet.

Variation:

Fold your paper exactly in half and only glue down 2/3rds of it. The other remaining third, cut into a handle to look like a purse.

Optional:

Put a piece of Velcro so that your wallet will stay closed and can be easily opened.







Gragger

out of a Paper Plate

Supplies:

- Two 9 inch paper plates
- Small handful of beans or rice
- · Stapler with staples
- Tissue paper
- Glue
- Hole puncher
- Ribbon



Directions:

- Cut the tissue paper into small squares.
- 2. Cover the bottom of one of the plates (the side that touches the table when you eat) with glue.
- Cover the glue with the tissue paper squares.
- 4. Do the same to the other plate.
- 5. Let dry.
- 6. Put a handful of beans or rice into one of the plates.
- Carefully staple the two plates together so that none of the beans fall out.
- 8. Make a hole (or holes) around the edge and add ribbon hanging from it. When you shake your gragger, the ribbon will "fly."
